CTEC INSTRUCTOR: BARBARA TUYEN

Barbara Tuyen has been a dedicated CTE agriculture instructor since 1999, with extensive experience in teaching various agriculture courses such as plant and soil science, horticulture, and landscape design. Currently, Barbara holds positions as an agriculture instructor and FFA Advisor at Don Antonio Lugo High School in Chino and the Urban Agriculture instructor at The Learning Centers at Fairplex.

Her educational journey started at Mt. San Antonio Community College, where Barbara earned an A.A. degree in Liberal Arts before transferring to Cal Poly Pomona's College of Agriculture. There, she focused her studies on Agriculture Science with a specialization in agriculture education. In May 2023, Barbara completed her M.A. degree in Career and Technical Education at Cal State San Bernardino's College of Education. Furthermore, she advanced her credentials by enrolling in an administrative credentialing program at CSUSB, with the aim of obtaining certifications in CTE supervision and K-12 administration.

Barbara believes it's important for students to understand the social and economic impacts of agriculture and learn of the career opportunities within the industry. Using The Farm as her classroom, Barbara provides hands-on learning experiences, sharing knowledge about sustainable farming practices while fostering confidence in her students' skills. Barbara ensures her students benefit from enriching opportunities such as tours and guest speakers throughout the year to enhance their educational journey.

CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION CENTER (CTEC)

This Spring, CTEC is thrilled to have 130 students. Enrollment is up 62.5% over last Fall's semester with Welding taking a lead in enrollment. Fifty-seven students are enrolled in Welding Manufacturing and fifty- five in Automotive Technology. This semester we also initiated a pilot program with Azusa Unified School District that provides transportation for 15 of its students to AXC for CTEC's Intro to Welding Manufacturing course. In addition, we are working with Opportunities for Learning & Options for Youth Charter School to arrange transportation for their students to attend evening courses.



ALEX XYDIAS & PETE CHAPOURIS CENTER FOR AUTOMOTIVE ARTS (AXC)





Serving the largest class of students post-pandemic, AXC is the bedrock of TLC's Career and Technical Education Center. Much of the success of the education center has been due to the precedent set by AXC at the inception of CTEC. Today, the program continues to thrive, with the Automotive Technology pathways boasting four class levels. Welding Manufacturing, which opened in 2019, commenced its first semester in Spring of 2020. However, midway through, class transitioned to virtual instruction due to the pandemic. Despite this interruption, it has evolved into one of the most highly desired pathways, frequently with a waiting list for enrollment. The career tech pathways housed at the AXC Petersen Garage provides students with an educational opportunity that can grow into a career, as highlighted by Geovani Diaz's Story.

Without the generosity of one of AXC's original donors, the Robert and Margie E. Petersen Foundation in honor of racing legend Alex Xydias, none of this would be possible. We hope you'll continue to join them in supporting these transformational programs.
