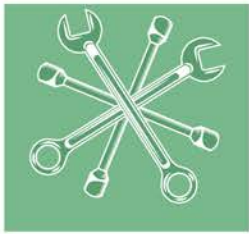

FROM CLASSROOM TO CROPS: SPRING HIGHLIGHTS IN URBAN AGRICULTURE

This spring, our Urban Agriculture students stepped beyond the classroom and into the heart of California's agricultural world through a series of immersive, hands-on experiences designed to connect them with real-world practices and career pathways.



At Cal Poly Pomona, students explored the greenhouses and microgreens container farm, gaining insight into how innovation and sustainability are shaping the future of agriculture. Their tour of the College of Agriculture also included visits to the grow pods and equine center, where they learned about animal care, facility management, and the science behind modern agriculture.

The journey continued at Mt. San Antonio College, where students toured the swine, sheep, and nursery centers—experiencing firsthand the care and effort it takes to raise animals and maintain healthy crops.



In celebration of Earth Day, our students returned to Cal Poly to participate in their annual Earth Day Celebration, contributing to event setup and engaging with the campus community on environmental awareness and sustainability efforts.



At The Farm at Fairplex, students got their hands dirty preparing for the LA County Fair, planting new crops and helping care for livestock. A standout moment? Assisting with the care of bottle-fed animals and learning how to milk goats, giving students both confidence and real-world experience in animal husbandry.

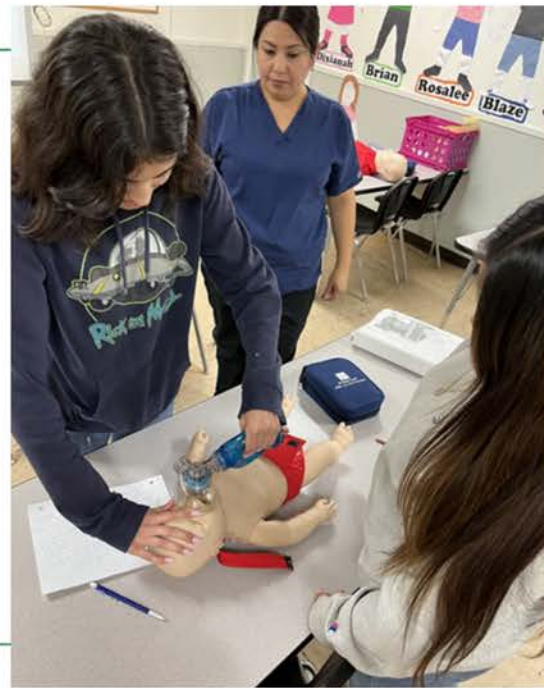




SPRING HIGHLIGHTS FROM CTEC'S CHILD DEVELOPMENT

This spring, CTEC's Child Development pathway provided students with hands-on experiences that supported both personal and professional growth in early childhood education.

A key part of the program is weekly field experience the Child Development Center at Fairplex, where second- and third-semester students practiced essential skills like communication, professional behavior, and positive guidance. These real-world interactions helped students gain confidence and determine if early childhood education is the right fit.



In addition to working with children, students also complete professional certifications, including child CPR training. This spring, each student took part in instructor-led CPR sessions using training mannequins, gaining life-saving skills and preparing for safety in early childhood settings.

These experiences help build responsibility, care, and confidence as students prepare for the workforce or further education in child development. The CTEC Child Development pathway continues to offer a strong mix of classroom learning and real-world experience, shaping thoughtful, capable future professionals.



WELDING STUDENTS EXPLORE CAREER PATHWAYS AT SHEET METAL WORKERS TRAINING CENTER

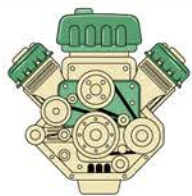
On Wednesday, April 23, CTEC Welding students visited the Sheet Metal Workers Southern California Training Center in City of Industry for an exclusive tour and hands-on career exploration experience.

Students learned about various pathways within the sheet metal trade—HVAC, architectural metalwork, welding, drafting, and fabrication—while exploring the state-of-the-art training facility, observing apprentices, and asking questions about the program and application process.

From cutting-edge tools to the benefits of paid union apprenticeships, the visit gave students a clear look at promising careers in the skilled trades. Many left inspired and motivated to pursue these opportunities.

This tour reflects CTEC's ongoing commitment to connecting students with real-world experiences and high-wage, high-demand career paths.





AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY: FROM CLASSROOM TO SHOP FLOOR

This spring, CTEC's Automotive Technology students immersed themselves in a dynamic, hands-on learning experience that blended technical instruction with real-world application. From changing brake systems to replacing engine cylinders, students didn't just learn about cars—they brought their lessons to life under the hood.

Guided by their respective instructor Ignacio Alvarez and Felix Carrillo, students applied their classroom knowledge directly in the shop. They explored the mechanics of braking systems and engine components, then teamed up to disassemble and install parts with precision and care. Lessons on combustion, compression, and timing evolved into practical, confidence-building tasks that mirrored real industry work.



In addition to mechanical skills, students honed vital soft skills such as collaboration, communication, and problem-solving. Working in teams, they navigated challenges together and discovered the importance of patience, leadership, and attention to detail.

We celebrate the growth and determination of our Automotive Technology students and look forward to watching them drive their skills into the future.

This spring, CTEC students participated in mock interviews—a key part of our Essential Skills and Career Readiness programming. These sessions gave students practical experience in presenting themselves professionally and responding to common interview questions.

With the support of our community and industry partners who volunteered as interviewers, students had the opportunity to practice vital soft skills in a structured, real-world setting. Each student met with one or more professionals from a variety of fields, answered job-relevant questions, and received helpful feedback on how to improve.



From making eye contact and clearly explaining their goals to refining their responses, students worked on building confidence and communication skills. Volunteers provided honest, constructive insights to help students strengthen their interview technique and better understand what employers are looking for.

This event was more than just interview practice—it helped students build self-awareness, navigate professional conversations, and understand how to make a strong first impression. For many, it was their first interview experience, and it gave them a new sense of confidence and direction.



At CTEC, we know workforce preparation goes beyond technical skills. Through mock interviews, resume workshops, and essential skills training, we equip students to face the future with confidence and purpose.
