Los Angeles International Wine Competition Judging March 25, 26, & 27, 2026 Mrs. Spreti Valente, Wine Chair

The Los Angeles International Wine Competition and its panel of esteem judges invite you to participate in the 91st anniversary competition.

1. **ENTRY FEE** ⁽¹⁾ – Early Bird - \$90 per entry received before January 5, 2026, \$115 per entry beginning January 6,2025. Payment may be made by credit card: Visa, MasterCard, American Express or Discover, by U.S. check payable to: "Los Angeles County Fair Association", or by wire transfer. Please email a copy of the wire transfer to the Competitions office at competitions@fairplex.com. Entry fee must accompany entry form to be eligible for competition.

 SHIPPING – International wine will be accepted through March 6, 2026. Shipments are received on weekdays from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. All wines entered MUST BE SHIPPED PREPAID. The competition is not responsible for any customs or shipping charges.

Wines being sent to the competition from outside the U.S. require an FDA number, FDA Prior Notice, pro forma invoice and Cola Waiver before shipping to:

^{*}Early bird discounted fees must be paid by January 5, 2026, to qualify.

^{*}All other entry fees must be received by the entry deadline February 27, 2026, to be entered to the 2026 competition.

⁽¹⁾ Entry fees are non-refundable

International shipments of wine must be cleared by a licensed broker with applicable importing licenses. If you have an importer, it is best to use your own importer. If you do not have an importer, you can contact Mark Newman with Accolade Brands, mark@accoladebrands.com to provide this service.

<u>REGISTERED FDA NUMBER</u>: You must obtain registration with the FDA (see below). If you have an FDA registration number, you might need to renew your account information with the FDA. Renewals should have been completed by December 31, 2024. Otherwise, new registration may be required: https://www.fda.gov/food/guidance-regulation-food-and-dietary-supplements/registration-food-facilities-and-other-submissions.

An Authorized US Agent is required for all new and renewed FDA Permits. Accolade Brands can assist you with this service for 180 Euros (95 Euros is for the Producer Registration and 85 Euros is for the US Agent fee) for the 2025/2026 calendar year registration which goes through December 31, 2026. The FDA also requires a UFI or a DUNS number. If your company does not have a DUNS number, we will request one for you. The fee is 25 Euros. It is best to fill out the form at the end of the guidelines and email to Mark Newman, mark@accoladebrands.com. You can file for your permit; however, a US FDA Agent will have to verify the application and there will still be a fee.

FDA Prior Notice: Mark Newman with Accolade Brands, mark@accoladebrands.com, can assist with this service. You must file a Prior Notice with FDA online before shipping. https://www.fda.gov/industry/prior-notice-imported-foods. If you are unsure about filing the FDA Prior Notice you can contact Mark Newman at Accolade Brands to perform this service for those producers that do not have an importer or FDA US Agent. See below the fees charged for these services.

TTB SAMPLE WAIVER (COLA WAIVER): All sample shipments to the US must be accompanied by a TTB Sample Waiver issued to a Federal and State Licensed Importer. The typical waiting time is five to seven business days if all the paperwork is in order. https://www.ttb.gov/import-export/itd/importing-alcohol-for-trade-shows

If you do not have an importer, the Los Angeles International Wine Competition works with Accolade Brands to clear shipments. - Payment must be prepaid by credit card through PayPal to Accolade Brands. Your shipping documents should indicate that you will pay for all Customs Charges. If you do not properly designate that you will pay the customs fee, your customs fees must be paid by credit card or wire transfer within 72 hours from billing.

COMPETITION GUIDELINES & INFORMATION INTERNATIONAL ENTRIES

- FDA Food Facility Registration 95 Euros/per company (only needed if not previously registered with the FDA)
- FDA Agent Filing <u>85 Euros</u> per year per Company. FDA requires that you have a USA Agent. The permit is issued for the one remaining calendar year through December 31, 2025. This is required by the FDA for your shipment to legally arrive in the United States.
- Permit Renewals permits issued in 2025/2026, will automatically be renewed in December 2026 for the period of January 1, 2027, through December 31, 2028. The renewal will be <u>85 Euros per year for a total of 170 Euros</u>.
- UFA DUNS Number The FDA also requires an UFA (Unique Facility Identifier) DUNS number. The fee for the UFI number is 25 Euros.
- Customs Charges Taxes & Duty are to be paid by each producer

- Please complete a Proforma Invoice that includes the quantity, name of the wine, the type (i.e., white, red or a varietal name) and the alcohol content. YOU MUST DESIGNATE THAT YOU WILL BE CHARGED FOR ALL U.S. CUSTOMS CHARGES ON YOUR INTERNATIONAL SHIPPING DOCUMENTS OR AIRWAY BILL. Accolade Brands is not responsible for U.S. Customs & Brokerage Charges and if this is not done properly, your shipment could be delayed until we receive payment for these charges. If the shipment is large enough for commercial airfreight, we must collect estimated tax, duty, and customs charges in advance. The commercial value for samples is typically one Euro per bottle and this should be stated on a proforma invoice.
 - Option 1 Use UPS, FedEx, or DHL. Please charge your UPS, FedEx, or DHL account and include payment of all Customs Charges. The shipment must be DDP, Tax and Duty to be paid by the producer.
 - We require a credit card number just in case you have not completed the shipping forms correctly and you will only be billed for any excess charges or taxes that are billed to our account for your shipment.
 - Option 2 Airline airfreight or DHL. This is usually a more expensive option than UPS or FedEx.
 All WINE BOTTLES: Must have a label affixed to the back of the bottle that contains the US
 Government Warning: The phrase "Contains Sulfites" and the phrase "Trade Samples Not for Resale." The words "Government Warning" must appear in capital letters and in bold type. The remainder of the statement may NOT appear in bold type. The statement MUST appear as a continuous paragraph. The statement reads as follows and should be 2mm to 3 mm in size.

GOVERNMENT WARNING: (1) ACCORDING TO THE SURGEON GENERAL, WOMEN SHOULD NOT DRINK ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES DURING PREGNANCY BECAUSE OF THE RISK OF BIRTH DEFECTS.

(2) CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IMPAIRS OUR ABILITY TO DRIVE A CAR OR OPERATE MACHINERY, AND MAY CAUSE HEALTH ROBLEMS.

- 3. **ENTRIES** ⁽²⁾ An entry shall consist of at least three (6) bottles. Each bottle entry is 250 ml to 500 ml (if bottles contain less than 250 ml, please send 4 bottles). PLEASE LIST CLASS/CATEGORY NUMBERS ON ENTRY FORM. Entries are assigned random judging codes and then placed on storage racks in our cellar separated into categories. All deliveries should be received by the shipping deadline (March 6), allowing ample time for wines to recover from transportation bottle shock before being judged. Before judging, servers place codes on the tasting glasses, and the wines are carefully poured into the proper glasses. The coded tasting glasses are then placed in front of each judge. Each judge tastes the wine and makes selections independently.
- 4. **Judging**: The Los Angeles International Wine Competition uses a 100-point scoring system based on Appearance, Aroma, Taste, and Finish.

The decision of the judges is final, and no changes will be made to awards after the judging is complete.

- 5. Awards and Medals: We award Gold, Silver, Bronze Best of Class, Best of Division and Best of Show. An award or medal is given to a producer for a particular wine produced. Best of Class awards will be awarded by division, category. Best of Class wines will compete for Best of Division. Best of Division wines will compete for the "Don Galleano Award" in honor of Don Galleano. The Los Angeles International Wine Competition will offer, for purchase, Best of Show, Best of Division, Best of Class, Gold, Silver, and Bronze award seals to the producers that won these awards.
- 6. Results: April 6, 2026, the competition results will be posted on the website www.LAWineComp.com.
- 7. May 7 31, 2026 is the Los Angeles County Fair. All International Competition award-winning products will be displayed in the Tasting Room. There will also be gold medal wine and olive oil tastings, and education seminars featuring entrants from Olive Oil, Wine, Spirits and Dairy competitions in the Tasting Room education classroom.
